
#### Annual Holiday Open House Held on Dec. 8

#### **Vonnie Gutzeit** June 25, 1933 – November 25, 2015



There will be a celebration of life for Vonnie on January 10, 2016 at 2:00pm at the Lynn Cancer Institute.

We would like to recognize Vonnie Gutzeit, known as Boca Raton Regional Hospital's (then Boca Raton Community Hospital) "First Employee." Vonnie joined the Hospital in January of 1964, over three years before the Hospital opened its doors to patients in 1967. Vonnie served as the executive assistant to Frank Dawson, the Hospital's first president. She later served as the Director of Medical Staff Services, eventually retiring in June of 1999.

Vonnie never truly left the Hospital, as she continued serving the organization for another 16 years. Vonnie took Board of Trustee minutes and later served as secretary for the Medical Staff Review Committee, a role she held until November 2015. She was an active member of the Debbie-Rand Memorial Service League, serving as Historian and working very closely with Joan Wargo on numerous projects. Joan

shared with us that Vonnie and Joan's husband, Dr. Donald Wargo, hand-wrote the first bylaws for the Medical Staff.

In all, Vonnie served our organization for 51 years. Vonnie, we thank you for all that you did for Boca Raton Regional Hospital and the Debbie-Rand Memorial Service League.

Time to Prepare for The Joint Commission Compliance

As in past years, we will have **mandatory orientation for all D-RMSL volunteers**. In order to remain in active status, you **must attend** this important presentation. Kathy Davis, ARNP, Employee Health Nurse, will be on hand ten minutes prior to each orientation to administer Tuberculosis (TB) tests to volunteers who have patient contact and who require the screenings.
