

This is Our Story, continued

At the time, Boca Raton was a city of 10,000 people and the nearest hospitals were 20 to 30 minutes away. Following the death of the children from the accidental ingestion of a poison, many sympathetic residents who were moved by the loss believed that the children's lives might have been saved had the medical facilities been closer.

Motivated by this conviction, a group of influential, civic-minded Boca Raton residents formed the Debbie-Rand Foundation, Inc., its members dedicated to leading a public drive for funds to erect a hospital built by and for the people of Boca Raton. Its destiny was to become Boca Raton Community Hospital, a non-profit institution serving the needs of a rapidly expanding city and its environs.

The Foundation was barely organized when suggestions were made that it needed a service league to help raise the necessary funds for a hospital. Again, quoting from the foreword to the By-Laws of the League: "The idea of organizing the Debbie-Rand Memorial Service League, Inc. was conceived by a few (18) civic-minded women of the area who were cognizant of the need for a hospital in and for Boca Raton."

Article II of the By-Laws states: "The purpose of this league shall be to raise funds (and to) coordinate volunteer services and other beneficial activities for the establishment of a hospital in Boca Raton."

A set of By-Laws was written and an organizational meeting was planned for September 28, 1962; 350 women and one man would attend. At its first annual membership meeting on February 4, 1963, Mrs. Drummond was elected the League's first president.
