#### Glove It Up!

Cleanliness is the second most important concern of patients when choosing a hospital. In the public's mind, cleanliness and infection control are aligned, which produce the perception of a pleasant, tidy and safe environment.

You've heard the saying "everything has its place." Garbage has its place too. Sometimes, it is difficult to pick up garbage because teammates do not have a barrier device (paper towel or glove) to pick up the item. To help teammates create a culture of cleanliness, Boca Raton Regional Hospital is implementing the Glove It Up! Program.

#### The Glove It Up! guidelines are:

- 1. Always carry two gloves with you. Carrying two gloves at all times will help to ensure that teammates ALWAYS have a barrier device to keep the floors clean.
- 2. When you see garbage on the floor, use a glove to pick up the garbage. This creates a barrier between you and the item.
- 3. Dispose of the garbage in the appropriate trash container.
- 4. Wash your hands or use foam.
- 5. Replace the glove.

#### If you notice a spill on the floor:

Clean up the spill or contact Environmental Services and ensure the area is safe by:

- 1. Placing paper towels on the spill
- 2. Standing by the spill and guiding others to walk around the spill
- 3. Getting a wet floor sign and placing it by the spill

#### **SHINE Program**

#### SERVING HEALTH INSURANCE NEEDS OF ELDERS

As we are all aware, understanding Medicare, supplemental health insurance, long-term care and prescription coverage is a daunting task for even the most well informed. If you are about to turn 65, it's even more important for you to have a firm grasp of the options and choices you have.

That's why we urge you to take advantage of the SHINE Program (Serving Health Insurance Needs of Elders). Conducted by Harold Wolkoff, a Debbie-Rand volunteer and a trained SHINE consultant, sessions are available to assist those currently on Medicare, or those soon to be eligible, in navigating the complexities of senior healthcare coverage. Family members and caregivers are also welcome. Harold provides this instruction on Monday and Wednesday mornings in the Education Center by appointment only. 

#### A Decade of Distinction

**BOCA REGIONAL IN TOP 5% OF HOSPITALS NATIONWIDE** 

Healthgrades® – the nation's leading independent healthcare ratings organization – has named Boca Raton Regional Hospital a Distinguished Hospital for Clinical Excellence™ for the tenth year in a row – only 24 of the nation's 4,500 hospitals have earned such a consecutive distinction. This designation places Boca Raton Regional Hospital among the top 5% of hospitals nationwide for clinical performance.



In addition, Boca Raton Regional Hospital earned six Five-Star Ratings from Healthgrades (the highest possible), for the treatment of Heart Attack, treatment of Heart Failure, Colorectal Surgeries, treatment of GI Bleed, treatment of Bowel Obstruction and treatment of Sepsis. The Hospital was also ranked in the top 10% nationally for Overall Cardiac Services, Cardiology Services, Overall Gastrointestinal Services and General Surgery.

"This truly reflects a decade of distinction and success," said Jerry Fedele, President and CEO of Boca Regional. "We give credit and thanks to our physicians, nurses, staff and volunteers who made this achievement possible."

The recipients of the Distinguished Hospital Award for Clinical Excellence stand out among the rest for overall clinical excellence across a broad spectrum of care. During the 2014 study period (2010-2012) these hospitals showed superior performance in clinical outcomes for patients in the Medicare population across at least 21 of 30 of the most common inpatient conditions and procedures —as measured by objective performance data (risk-adjusted mortality and in-hospital complications).


