## **New Emergency Communication Platform**

Boca Raton Regional Hospital will serve to make us more effective and efficient during emergency situations. AlertMedia provides staff with important notifications and updates on situations affecting the Hospital via email, text, voicemail and app push notification. The system is similar to those used by universities and colleges and other large organizations when critically important information must be relayed quickly to a number of large constituencies.

AlertMedia also allows for end-users to reply to notifications with questions or feedback or to call an emergency phone number for further information.

The technology can also be employed to inform staff of critically important operations and maintenance matters, office closures and other issues that could affect the work day or environment in a material way.

We provide an "opt-in" option to all doctors, staff and volunteers — as well as patients and family members — to access this technology.

I urge you to take advantage of this free, secure communication platform. Clearly, it will enhance those we already have in place to be used in emergency situations or when timely and thorough communication is needed in various operational matters.
