November Volunteer of the Month






To our Board of Trustees and all who wear the blue jackets, thank you for your work and support in these accomplishments. My gratitude is beyond measure.

The Art of Recovery

The Art of Recovery is a new pilot program initiated in July by Jamil Wilcox, who is a pre-med student studying Neuroscience at Florida Atlantic University and the Director of the Art of Recovery program. The program at the Marcus Neuroscience Institute (MNI) provides a source of therapy for patients to express themselves through art. The type of art available to patients is comprised of painting and drawing. Research supports that art therapeutics help patients with their mental, physical and emotional well-being, oftentimes reducing their pain and stress levels. It also offers a creative process through the act of self-expression. A major benefit of the program is the improvement of patient and family satisfaction during their stay. We've had many touching stories over the last month and would like to share one that stood out:

"We had a wonderful patient stay with us for nearly two weeks with most of their time spent bed ridden. The first time we asked him to participate in the program he was reluctant to try it as he had never painted before. Even though he didn't participate, he enjoyed his conversation so much he agreed to participate two days later. He told us that he really enjoyed his experience and was so proud of his piece of art, so we hung it in his room. Sadly, three days later he passed away. We were able to give his family his art work and they were so touched to have it, knowing he was so proud of his accomplishment and enjoyed his time painting. The patient's family said they plan on displaying his piece of art during the funeral service."
